AI BUM NOTES


"Miami = Dance." The rich culture of dance has been an integral phenomenon in Miami's diverse history. Each movement of the Miami Concerto for Guitar and Orchestra features a characteristic dance rhythm. Bailamos, the first movement, is a couple's sensual dance which uses the Guaguanco, a subgenre of the Cuban Rumba. The energetic guitar writing is equally lyric as it is rhythmic, with the orchestra providing a dynamic accompaniment from the percussion section and lyricism from the strings. Romántico, the second movement, features the Tango, a combination of African and European dance influences, a partner dance originating from the border area between Argentina and Uruguay. Here, a romanticism evoking a calm, warm wind on a seashore is manifested in the cantabile of the guitar and accompanying lush strings. The guitar is featured in a short cadenza which segues into another nostalgic theme of hope and optimism. Festivo, the third movement, showcases the Bembestandard drumming patterns originating in Afro-Cuban cultures. In this movement, the guitar and orchestra are equal partners contributing thematic and rhythmic material, culminating in a rousing finale. This work of love is a tribute to Miami, my second home, and the closeness and love I feel for this ebullient, colorful and lively city. Miami Concerto for Guitar and Orchestra was premiered by the Miami Symphony Orchestra under conductor Eduardo Marturet and autiarist Sharon Isbin.

Modeled after the Cuban Habanera rhythm, the European import of the island dance, **Habanera Nights** is comprised of an ensemble of a solo guitar, piano and cello trio, and is accompanied by a battery of Latin-inspired percussion. It evokes an atmosphere of the laid-back sensual energy of a couple dancing, under a humid, moonlit evening.

Urban Tango is my personal take on the Tango. Born in the impoverished areas between the borders of Buenos Aires, Argentina, and Montevideo, Uruguay, this partner dance spread to the rest of the world as one of the most well-known forms of dance, due to its honesty and transparency of human emotions. The couple, represented in my piece by the guitar and piano, embody the partnership between the two instruments, equally generous and soulful, blending with the unconventional sounds of life in my native New York City. The captivating dance of the two instruments, flows sensually, yet is edgy with heightened emotions – a glass and concrete jungle set on top of a beautiful city island.

Soloist with over 200 orchestras, winner of Munich ARD, Madrid and Toronto Competitions, Germany's Echo Klassik and Guitar Player's Best Classical Guitarist awards, she performed in Scorsese's Oscar-winning The Departed, the Obama White House and as the only classical artist in 2010 Grammys. Sharon Isbin: Troubadour won ASCAP's Television Broadcast Award and streams on PBS Passport/Amazon. Author of the Classical Guitar Answer Book, she premiered nearly 100 works written for her and directs guitar departments at The Julillard School and Aspen Music Festival.
